eat. This malformation requires resection of the sublingual frenum attachment so	uch that an anatomically
appropriate range of tongue motion is established. This procedure, a sublingual	frenectomy, will rectify
the above situation and allow this child to feed properly and will take away important	ediments to feeding
desire.
